
It takes a village to make this a fun and memorable event for the kids. We need volunteers to help with set up and clean up and lots of food donations because these kids like to eat!

ENTREPRENEURS

A big focus in Core is cultivating an entrepreneurial spirit. The businesses we run help the students organically learn many real world skills - quality control, perseverance, marketing, sales, talking to strangers, calculating budgets, income, costs and profit, collaboration, networking, goal-setting, and innovation. JMG runs the Snack Shack every Wednesday from 2-2:30 providing snacks and supplies. In conjunction with that they launch multiple businesses over the course of the year. The first is our Bread & Butter Business where we bake you breakfast for you on Thanksgiving Break. Included is a loaf of bread, honey butter, and a cup of coffee for \$15 delivered on Tuesday 11/25. More to come on the success or failure of this first business. *JMG uses the money they earn to donate locally, buy themselves apparel, throw a year-end ceremony, and leave behind in legacy to next year's JMG Core.*

For the month of November, the 5th through 8th grade teachers recognized the following students as their Students of the Month:





Notes from Mrs. Greaves



Happy Holidays! While I don't love the cold weather, I do love to see the sparkling snow and the lights of the holiday season. We still have a good supply of winter gear (some new and some slightly used) for students in need. There is nothing worse than being cold, so feel free to reach out to me or have your child stop by the nurse's office and we will do our best to get them geared up for the cold weather.

We are seeing lots of sniffles and coughs consistent with the common cold. Students with a fever of 100.4 or higher combined with a cough, sore throat, headache, and body aches should stay home until their fever has resolved without the use of fever-reducing medicine for 24 hours. Anyone with vomiting or diarrhea should remain at home for 24 hours after the last bout of vomiting or diarrhea. Adhering to these guidelines help prevent the spread of illness in our school. Flu season has slowly started in Maine over the past couple of weeks. As I write this, I am not aware of any cases of influenza in our school. The last CDC report indicated only 5 cases in Penobscot county were reported during the week of Nov. 16th. I am including a flu symptom checklist for your reference.

December is a short month at Ridge View with students being home almost as much as they are in school. I hope that families get to enjoy the extra family time and make memories with their children. As a mom of all adult children, soak up the moments over this holiday break.

Does my child have the flu?

Yes	No	Does your child have a fever of 100 degrees or more?
Yes	No	Does your child have a cough?
Yes	No	Does your child have a sore throat?


Should I keep my child home?

If you checked yes to:

Fever of 100 degrees or more
And
A cough **or** a sore throat

Your child has an influenza-like illness. Keep your child home for 24 hours after the fever resolves without the use of medication.

If you checked yes to only one of the questions above, or if your child is ill with other symptoms, keep your child at home at least one day to observe for additional symptoms. If additional symptoms develop, use the checklist questions again to decide whether to continue to keep the child home.


