Notes from Mrs. Greaves

Wow! How are we ready to start 2026 already? It feels like the fall flew by! To me, it seems like the cold, wintery weather drags on forever. I still have a good supply of winter gear available if anyone is in need. I prefer warm weather and sunshine, but for anyone that enjoys playing outside, it is important to have warm gear. It definitely makes outdoor play much more enjoyable. The Wellness team will have some fun challenges coming up over February and April breaks to encourage students and families to get outside and make memories.

Immunization reminders will be sent out over the next several months for any students in need of immunizations. All students enrolled in a Maine public school must be up to date on all state required vaccines. Students entering seventh grade next year will need to have updated Tdap and Meningococcal vaccines. If your child is not up to date, you will be notified by mail. We want parents to have plenty of time to make appointments before the start of a new school year. If you have immunization questions, feel free to reach out to me at any time.

We will continue working on our annual hearing and vision screenings throughout the spring. Routine screenings are completed for students in pre-K, kindergarten, first, third, fifth, and seventh grades. If you have concerns about your child's hearing or vision, you may reach out to Mrs. Bavelaar or myself to request screening. Parents are notified by mail of any results that do not pass.

My monthly reminders:

Students may not have or transport any medications, even over the counter medications.

Please pack a spare set of clothing for your child. We cannot provide spare clothing unless it is a true emergency involving bodily fluids.

Students with a temperature of 100.4 or higher must remain out of school for 24 hours AFTER the fever has resolved without the use of fever-reducing medication.

Students with vomiting or diarrhea must be out of school for 24 hours since the last episode of vomiting or diarrhea.

Builders Club




